1.	AIC should provide details of GT available in Tehsils where work order is sought to be issued as this will have considerable impact on the accuracy & quality of the assessment.	Ground Truthing is responsibility of the Bidders. However, Ground Truthing, if any available with AIC will be shared along with the work order.
2.	The work order scope given on page 3 is not clear. Please clarify what is meant by ' Each village level for the assigned village'.	Analysis and reports must be provided for village level in case work order issued at village level and in case work order issued at survey number wise, the analysis and reports must be provided at survey number wise.
3.	On page 3 please change the clause to read 'the final report should be submitted in 15 Working days, not considering Saturdays, Sundays and Public holidays.' Timelines for completion of work order should be commensurate with quantum of work involved.	Working days will be considered as per working days of AIC Regional Office of the concerned State.
4.	One page 3 it is mentioned that the qualification details of the domain experts personnel shall be incorporated with the reports. Hence the requirement of ' The list of professionals with their qualification and experience is enclosed' as mentioned in the draft cover letter cum undertaking needs to be deleted.	Refer the revised Annexure-1.
5.	The cover letter cum undertaking mentions 'offer to analyse/investigate the CCE based yield as mentioned in the AIC tender document'. This needs to be amended as there is no such mention in the tender.	Refer the revised Annexure-1.
6.	Reporting format needs to be clearly specified by AIC prior to issue of work order to avoid dispute/delays during payment.	Report format shall be provided along with work order.
7.	With regard to payment terms clauses 4 & 5 are draconian and need to be reasonably and fairly amended.	As per Tender Document.
8.	Payment clause 6 needs to be deleted and payment for satisfactory completion of any portion of work order by due date should be payable. There could be genuine reasons for not being able to complete the entire work order assigned.	As per Tender Document.
9.	Does the service provider required to collect geotags in case ground truthing data is not available for any village with AIC? Kindly clarify.	Ground Truthing is responsibility of the Bidders.

10.	Kindly provide details approx. how many survey numbers will be assigned in a village for Crop Health Assessment?	AIC cannot assure quantum of work.
11.	What if Cadastral boundary will not be available with Govt agency?	It is mandatory to use verified cadastral maps for the assigned units for the analysis specified in the scope of work by the successful Bidder.
12.	As it is mentioned in the tender document that the workorder will be given for assigned Survey number wise in a village and/ or Each village level for the assigned village (Page no-3, Section-2, Scope of work), we would like to inquire that in which form the input will be provided? (e.g., in the form of spreadsheet for village list or in the form of spatial location or Boundary of plot etc.	AIC will provide the list of Villages / list of survey numbers in the form of excel spreadsheet.
13.	At page no. 6 of the tender document, it is mentioned that agency must possess the verified cadastral maps for Hanumangarh district of Rajasthan state. Kindly clarify that from where we can get the verified cadastral map of Hanumangarh District?	Bidder shall arrange the verified cadastral map of Hanumangarh District at their own from the available sources.
14.	Who will verify and validate the cadastral map if we have with us?	The Bidders would be responsible to ensure the accuracy of the cadastral maps, which can be verified by AIC / Government(s).
15.	In case, if you will provide us the work order in the form of survey number wise then can we assume that this survey number is already verified and validated? Kindly clarify.	No, the survey number is not verified by AIC. The assigned survey number shall be verified and validated by the Bidders.
16.	For Geospatial analysis, we must have administrative boundaries, So will AIC provide us the geospatial boundaries?	No, AIC will not provide any administrative / geospatial boundaries. The Bidder shall arrange all the required administrative / geospatial boundaries.
